We are opening a Saturday Music School called **Conservatoire Cerdd** in Aberystwyth which will start offering music education, including GCSE Music and a course to prepare for GCSE or other opportunities. Courses start September 2024

At the same time, the CIC staff and volunteers will seek out opportunities and support young musicians to perform and compete in various places such as the Eisteddfod Urdd. Concerts and recitals, playing in ensembles or solos to family, friends and the wider community will feature highly in the work, vital experiences to build confidence and self-esteem.

Helen's students have gone on to all the major conservatoires, places at Royal College of Music, Menuhin School, the Purcell School as well as Oxford and Cambridge Universities. Whilst studying here he appeared with many professional and semi-professional groups including the Halle Orchestra, BBC Philharmonic & Opera North. He worked as a professional horn player during this period. Following qualifying as a teacher Martin was Head of Music in Northamptonshire Secondary school where he taught for 24 years. Following a return to Wales Martin was also Head of Music at Aberaeron School.
